News from the Principal

Dear Families.

Welcome back to school! We warmly welcome our new families to the Mount Pleasant Primary School learning community. It has been incredible to all be back together onsite with students and staff. All of our students have settled well into classroom routines and are loving their learning spaces.

It has been wonderful to have a relatively normal start back to school this year! Please ensure all children are ready for learning each day with a hat, lunch, water bottle and clean uniform.

Code of Conduct:

On Friday we are sending home the student Code of Conduct form for families to discuss, sign and return to school.

At the beginning of the year, we remind our students and families of our school wide expectations. The school Code of Conduct applies to all members of our school community – <u>no-one is exempt from the Code</u> of Conduct.

Our teachers work with students at the beginning of the year to set up school expectations and students participate in developing these. We have always been grateful for the support we receive from our parent/family community in working with us to support a safe learning environment.

From time to time children may experience challenges at school. When this occurs we work in *partnership* to develop strategies to support children in a safe way for the benefit of everyone in our school.

Please ensure you discuss this with your child and return the signed Code of Conduct form. Please return this form by Friday 24th of February.

Foundation:

Welcome to our 2023 Foundation class. The children have done an exceptional job of transitioning to school. We are excited to be working with you to begin your child's learning journey at MPPS.

Repeated Reading:

One of the instructional practices we use at school is Repeated Reading. This process involves a student re-reading a passage 3 or more times. Repeated Reading helps children develop automaticity with decoding unknown words and developing their fluency. Being able to read around 100 words per minute is highly beneficial to comprehension. A fun activity at home is to set a 1 minute timer on your phone and

see if your child can "beat" the number of words per minute. This activity also give children a sense of accomplishment and celebration when they see they are improving.

School Uniform:

It has been pleasing to see so many of our students returning to school in full school uniform and with their hats!

Wearing a clean school uniform is compulsory at Mount Pleasant Primary School. Wearing a uniform develops a sense of belonging and promotes equality in our learning community, assists in student safety by ensuring staff are able to identify children when on local walks and excursions, and reduces clothing costs over time. Please ensure your child wears the correct and clean school uniform each day. Navy blue items such as shorts, pants, t shirts and jumpers can all be purchased at very reasonable prices from a range of stores such as Big W/Best and Less/K-Mart. For embroidered school uniform pieces you can purchase from Crockers in Ballarat.

Change of Contact details:

Please let the Admin Office know as soon as possible if your details such as phone number, address change.

Pick Up Times and After School Care:

A reminder that school pick up time is at 3.15pm. We kindly request that families observe these times. We have on site After School Care that you can book your child/ren into if you need a later pick up time. Contact Extend directly on: 1300 366 437

We discourage families picking children up early from school unless there is a valid reason to do so such as a medical appointment. If you arrive early to pick your child up without prior communication you may need to wait until there is an available staff member to go to the classroom to collect them. We advise families to please to please let their child's teacher know via email if they will need to leave school early.




Please help our school win the war against head lice by checking your child's hair over the holidays. Checking hair on a regularly basis helps us keep this issue under control. Thank you for your support.

During semester 1 on a Monday, the students from year's three to six will be involved in the specialist program – Kitchen Garden/STEM. Each week, the students will be engaged in learning about sustainability, growing fresh vegetables, soil health, growing seedlings, harvesting small crops, cooking



vegetables, creating simple recipes and trying out new tastes. We are hoping to have our current sensory garden transformed into a wonderful edible garden with a rotation of crops of seasonal vegetables and fruit throughout the year. Our first investigation will be how to identify and check the health of our soil. Stay tuned for the results of our experiments.

PARENT PAYMENTS AND SCHOOL CHARGES 2023

Mount Pleasant Primary School is committed to providing the best possible opportunities for all our students. In order to provide a high standard of service, some financial contributions from parents are necessary. School Council has approved a policy which levies a range of charges on parents; these are compliant with the DET Policy for Parent Payments.

The 2023 Book Packs have now been distributed to all students in class.

I thank all parents/guardians who have already paid, or made arrangements to pay, their School Charges for 2023. For those parents who have not yet done so, I ask that you make payment in the near future, via one of the following options;

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The General Office is open from 8.30 am to 4.00 pm each school day. We are happy to take payments in full or by instalment.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the Janine Schulze Business Manager.

Centrepay is a direct bill-paying service offered to customers receiving payments from Centrelink. Mount Pleasant Primary School is approved as a registered organisation for the Centrepay scheme and is able to take applications from families/guardians wishing to participate. Information brochures and Application forms are available from the School.

Eligible customers are encouraged to consider this option as an easy and effective way to pay school charges, camps and excursion costs.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) – 2023

We are now accepting applications for CSEF 2023. Application forms are available from the General Office. New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form

If you applied for the CSEF at Mount Pleasant Primary School in 2022, you do not need to complete an application form in 2023 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

Eligible families will receive \$125.00 per student, paid into the family account at Mount Pleasant Primary School. These funds can be allocated to school camps and excursions for 2023. I encourage parents to take advantage of this funding opportunity.

Sentral for Parents App

Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.





Step Two: Type in the school's name.



Step Three: Choose 'Register Here' from the bottom of the screen. Complete the details and choose 'Create Account'. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified to continue. When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.









Step Four: Choose your preferences

My friends and I we all hang out here


This is our school, where we're learning how
