

## **CHINESE**

In Chinese, the Foundation students have been exploring the structure of Chinese words by making Ms. Tian's name '田tián'. They also enjoyed singing the Chinese number song. Grade 1/2 students have learned a Chinese song '小xiǎo 白bái 兔 tù - little white rabbit'. They worked extremely hard to memorise the Chinese words and phrases both orally and handwritten. Students were provided with a picture to match the song lyrics. We talked about the characters in the picture and students had to sing the song lyrics to match the picture. They really enjoyed writing Chinese phrases whilst making their own illustrations. Grade 3/4 students have put in a great deal of effort when learning Chinese grammar and sentence structure; they learned to say 'How are you today? I'm very good, thank you!' through the Chinese greeting song. Students have a very good foundation for writing Chinese characters. They like to share their handwriting with their classmates and memorise Chinese characters by playing the matching card game. Grade 5/6 students have developed greater efficiency in recognising Chinese Pinyin and making correct Chinese pronunciation. They showed a strong interest in learning the Chinese song 'Good morning, good evening'.
