Dear Families and Friends,

Thank you to all of our families and students that attended Student Led Conferences on Tuesday! It was wonderful seeing smiling faces and happy families celebrating with their children and seeing their term learning 3 goals. Families all enjoyed spending that time hearing from their children and talking with teachers. Classroom teachers have now uploaded student learning goals to SeeSaw – you can view one of your child's learning goals here. Our goals change throughout the term as children consolidate new skills. Safe and Orderly Environment

At the beginning of this term we have focussed "being ready for learning" and "moving safely around our school". With this in mind, our whole school mantra is **"we enter our spaces like it's a movie theatre"** – children generally know how to enter a space like a movie theatre and translating this to the classroom makes sense for our students.

Student Wellbeing and Regulation

Our school has been embedding the <u>Interoception – Ready to Learn</u> Kit to support our learners to regulate their emotions and big feelings. <u>Interoception skills are required for a range of basic and</u> <u>more advanced functions such as knowing when to go to the toilet, being aware that you are</u> <u>becoming angry or upset and being able to manage your emotions proactively</u>. When children and young people have not yet developed interoception skills they will struggle with not only their own emotions but with social interactions and even just being around others may be difficult for them to manage.

We encourage all of our families to become familiar with these short exercises. These are especially beneficial at home too – as staff we use them in meetings and I have been using them at home with my own children. The first video is under 5 minutes.

NAPLAN Update - upcoming changes to NAPLAN reporting

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17 July 2023, DET has asked schools to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are:

- exceeding
- strong
- developing
- needs additional support


This change will give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels. Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This provides valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child. Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning. When we provide you with your results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean. As ever, you're welcome to speak to me, or your child's teacher with any questions about these changes.

BRAIN BUILDERS

This term in Grade 4, we have introduced "Brain Builders" rotations. It will happen three times a week and will consist of both literacy and numeracy rotations.



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For <u>Maths Brain Builders</u>, the students in their groups will either be playing Uno Multiplication Games, playing Prodigy (a maths adventure game), working on their number skills, or at the front with me completing a master class!





Similarly in <u>Literacy Brain Builders</u>, groups will rotate between Independent Reading, Word of the Day activities, Epic (an online book reading experience), or again at the front with me completing a Master Class.

Each group will be assigned a "Manager" for the day, who is responsible for keeping their group on task, and will help them with any questions they have. 😂

The Grade 4's have taken really well to Brain Builders, and I am excited to see how they all grow as we continue throughout the term.

MPPS Maths Update....

For each maths lesson, teachers at MPPS follow an Instructional Model that includes;

- Daily Review
- Fluency Pairs
- Number Talk
- Explicit teaching of concepts
- Independent/group exploration
- Reflection

In the coming weeks' newsletters, we will provide an overview of each of these parts of our maths lessons. We encourage you to chat to your children at home about these.

Daily Review

Every lesson begins with a Daily Review, which is exactly that – a review of content already taught. The Daily Review will go for approximately 10 minutes, depending on the grade level and content.

Intention – students review content they should know, to ensure it is stored in long term memory.

Tools – students may use whiteboards to demonstrate their thinking, however quick echo or cold call responses between teacher and student/s are used.



Engagement – due to the quick pace of the Daily Review and the immediate success for students this part of the lesson is engaging and encourages participation by all.

Our Instructional Model is supported by our professional learning around responsive teaching, to increase student engagement.

Sentral e-resource Registering on the Sentral for Parents App for the first time






Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.




Step Two: Type in the school's name.



Step Three: Choose 'Register Here' from the bottom of the screen. Complete the details and choose 'Create Account'. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified to continue. When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.



Step Four: Choose your preferences



Step Five: Connect to your child in this screen 'Add Access Key'. The access key is written on the note/email sent to you from the school. It is case sensitive so type it in exactly as it appears in the note/email.
