News from the Principal

Dear Families and Friends,

It's week 2 and our students (and staff!) have done a wonderful job of getting back into the swing of learning! We are especially excited to welcome our 2024 Foundation students and families to school.

The children have done an exceptional job of transitioning to school. Thank you for partnering with us to begin your child's learning journey at MPPS.

Code of Conduct:

On Friday we are sending home the student Code of Conduct form for families to discuss, sign and return to school.

At the beginning of the year, we remind our students and families of our school wide expectations. The school Code of Conduct applies to all members of our school community – no-one is exempt from the Code of Conduct.

Our teachers work with students at the beginning of the year to set up school expectations and students participate in developing these. We have always been grateful for the support we receive from our parent/family community in working with us to support a safe learning environment.

From time to time children may experience challenges at school. When this occurs, we work in partnership to develop strategies to support children in a safe way for the benefit of everyone in our school.

Please ensure you discuss this with your child and return the signed Code of Conduct form. Please return this form by Friday 23rd of February.

School Uniform and Hats:

It has been pleasing to see so many of our students returning to school in full school uniform and with their hats! Term 1 is a hat term in all schools in Victoria. It is compulsory that all children bring/wear a hat to school. A good check in the morning is – "got my shoes, got my hat".

Wearing a clean school uniform is compulsory at Mount Pleasant Primary School. Wearing a uniform develops a sense of belonging and promotes equality in our learning community, assists in student safety by ensuring staff are able to identify children when on local walks and excursions, and reduces clothing costs over time. Please ensure your child wears the correct and clean school uniform each day. Navy blue items such as shorts, pants, t shirts and jumpers can all be purchased at very reasonable prices from a range of stores such

as Big W/Best and Less/K-Mart. For embroidered school uniform pieces, you can purchase from Crockers in Ballarat.

Safer Internet Day:

It was Safer Internet Day on February 6th this week and we will be sending home our Acceptable Use Agreement (AUA) for our Year 3-6 students. We are all responsible for ensuring we are safe digital citizens





Safer Internet Day is a global initiative to raise awareness of online safety issues. The eSafety Commissioner leads the initiative in Australia. We educate people about online safety risks, like online abuse, how to be safe online and where to go for help. This Safer Internet Day we are being encouraged to take three simple actions when approaching online safety: Connect. Reflect. Protect.

Connect ~ safely by keeping apps and devices secure and reviewing your privacy settings regularly.

Reflect ~ on how your actions online may affect others or your safety.

Protect ~ yourself and others by visiting eSafety.gov.au to find out how to stay safe online and report online abuse.

By doing these things and sharing the Connect. Reflect. Protect message, we can work towards making every day a Safer Internet Day.



PARENT PAYMENTS AND SCHOOL CHARGES 2024

Mount Pleasant Primary School is committed to providing the best possible opportunities for all our students. In order to provide a high standard of service, some financial contributions from parents are necessary. School Council has approved a policy which levies a range of charges on parents; these are compliant with the DET Policy for Parent Payments.

The 2024 Book Packs have now been distributed to all students in class.

I thank all parents/guardians who have already paid, or made arrangements to pay, their School Charges for 2024. For those parents who have not yet done so, I ask that you make payment in the near future, via one of the following options;

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The General Office is open from 8.30 am to 4.00 pm each school day. We are happy to take payments in full or by instalment.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the Janine Schulze Business Manager.

Centrepay is a direct bill-paying service offered to customers receiving payments from Centrelink. Mount Pleasant Primary School is approved as a registered organisation for the Centrepay scheme and is able to take applications from families/guardians wishing to participate. Information brochures and Application forms are available from the School.

Eligible customers are encouraged to consider this option as an easy and effective way to pay school charges, camps and excursion costs.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) - 2024

We are now accepting applications for CSEF 2024. Application forms are available from the General Office. New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form

If you applied for the CSEF at Mount Pleasant Primary School in 2023, you do not need to complete an application form in 2024 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

Eligible families will receive \$125.00 per student, paid into the family account at Mount Pleasant Primary School. These funds can be allocated to school camps and excursions for 2024. I encourage parents to take advantage of this funding opportunity.

Sentral for Parents App

Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.










Step Four: Choose your preferences



My friends and I we all hang out here


