News from the Principal

Dear Families and Friends,

We are excited to be preparing for our **Open Classrooms** afternoon this term at Mount Pleasant Primary School. Please join us for a drop in visit on Tuesday 27th of February. Our school captains will open the gates at 2:45pm and staff will close the gates at 5:00pm. All children are dismissed at 3:15pm as usual and parents that take children earlier if they have visited a classroom are asked to please sign them out at the Admin Office.

School Council:

This year we are holding an election for School Council. It is wonderful that we have had so much interest in our school. School Council provides a limited governance and oversight role for the school promoting the broader directions and vision of the school as well as working to develop policy in accordance with DE guidelines, oversight of school Finance and Management reports, Strategic Plan and Annual Reporting. A well informed School Council and school councillors play an important role in strengthening community confidence in the school and helps to build and secure the school's reputation. Each family will receive a ballot and be asked to vote in this election. To assist in this process we have attached nominee statements at the back of this Newsletter and they are also included in a ballot form.

Playground Update:

Soon we will begin construction of our new playground. The architects have recently sent us through some choices of colours and we will be consulting with our students as part of this exciting process!

During construction we will have changes to areas children can play in and we will need to create a roster for year levels. This is a safety consideration and also a way to ensure we are keeping our youngest students playing safely. Thank you for your assistance in helping our learners understand this new routine.

Toys at School:

We kindly request that children do not bring toys/play items to school. This has the potential to cause significant disruption to daily routines for classes and teachers. Children become upset when things get broken and/or lost. The school supplies toys, fidgets and activities each day. This is an important routine for children to develop at the beginning of the school year.

Code of Conduct:

Reminder to please return the signed Code of Conduct and Acceptable Use Form for technology to the Admin Office by Friday 23rd of February.

At the beginning of the year, we remind our students and families of our school wide expectations. The school Code of Conduct applies to all members of our school community – no-one is exempt from the Code of Conduct.

School Drinks:

Reminder that only water is permitted at school. <u>Please do not allow children to come to school with cordial, sports or fizzy drinks</u>. These are not permitted to be consumed at school and kept until the end of the day for students to take home.

School Uniform and Hats:

It has been pleasing to see so many of our students returning to school in full school uniform and with their hats! Term 1 is a hat term is all schools in Victoria. It is compulsory that all children bring/wear a hat to school. A good check in the morning is – "got my shoes, got my hat"..

Change of Contact details:

Pick Up Times and After School Care:

A reminder that school pick up time is at 3.15pm. We kindly request that families observe these times. We have on site After School Care that you can book your child/ren into if you need a later pick up time. Contact Extend directly on: 1300 366 437

We discourage families picking children up early from school unless there is a valid reason to do so such as a medical appointment. If you arrive early to pick your child up without prior communication you may need to wait until there is an available staff member to go to the classroom to collect them. 








Step Four: Choose your preferences



My friends and I we all hang out here


