Contacting Teachers:

From time to time, you may need to contact your child/ren's teacher. The classroom teacher is the first point of contact (before the principal and admin office). We warmly welcome you to make contact with your child's teacher via email or calling to leave a message. You are also welcome to book in a parent teacher interview (in person or over the phone) to discuss any concerns you may have.

Students Leaving the Classroom:

Please remind your child/ren that leaving the classroom is not permitted at Mount Pleasant Primary School. Students need teacher permission to leave the classroom. This is to ensure the safety of all students and part of our Duty of Care. Just as children are not able to walk out of their front door at home without permission, the same applies at school. The teacher is responsible for student safety. When a child leaves the classroom without permission this jeopardises the operations of our school. The school may call the parent/care giver/guardian to pick the student up from school. Staying in the classroom is an important instruction for children to be able follow and allows the school to sign off on a student being able to attend camps/excursions.

Staff Right to Feel Safe:

We would like to alert all of our school community about the Department of Education's *"right to feel safe at work"* initiative. We continue to work on effective, positive and constructive communication with families. All of our staff have a right to feel safe at work. Parents, carers, advocates and adult members of the school community must engage respectfully with school staff. Unacceptable behaviour will be addressed promptly. This may include calling the police if required or issuing a School Community Safety Order. These behaviours are not permitted in-person, over the phone, by email, text message or on social media: Rudeness, Insults or offensive communication, Malicious or defamatory communications, Aggression, including raising your voice at a staff member, Harassment, Intimidation (passive or overt), Discriminatory or derogatory comments, Threatening gestures, Threats, Violence. These behaviours are never okay and can make staff and students feel unsafe in their workplace.

Sentral e-resource Registering on the Sentral for Parents App for the first time






Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.



Step Two: Type in the school's name.




Step Three: Choose 'Register Here' from the bottom of the screen. Complete the details and choose 'Create Account'. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified to continue. When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.



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Step Four: Choose your preferences



Step Five: Connect to your child in this screen 'Add Access Key'. The access key is written on the note/email sent to you from the school. It is case sensitive so type it in exactly as it appears in the note/email.



Step Five: You are now connected and can interact with the App.
