I am very excited to announce that we have welcomed Mr. G to our teaching team this week. Mr. G (Brayden Guareschi) has joined us to teach PE for the remainder of the year. He will be with us on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The students have loved seeing Mr. G back and are enjoying getting outside while this nicer weather is still here.

Camp:

Camp is almost upon us! Our Grade 4-6 students are heading off to Campaspe Downs on Wednesday next week for their 2-night camp. There will be lots of fun activities and our staff have been working hard to ensure that the camp is going to be absolutely amazing. We encourage our families at home to have some discussions about being prepared for different things at camp, giving new things a go (including activities and food!), and also about how we represent our MPPS community when we are at camp. As a school, we always receive feedback from places we visit for camps and excursions, and it is so pleasing when we hear positive comments about how the camp staff love having our students come for a visit.

Please make sure you review the 'what to pack' list with your child/ren attending and that all things are named. Camps are busy places and things inevitably get lost, it is great to return things quickly and easily when they are named. While students are attending camp, we remind you that it is a tech-free zone, and that all communication will be via the school. If you do have any further questions about the camp, please contact your child's classroom teacher.

Behaviour Curriculum:

As we have now settled into Term 2, classrooms have spent more time focusing on our School Wide Positive Behaviours and our routines for learning. Unfortunately, we have seen a little bit of unsettled behaviour in some students. I know that our new Behaviour Curriculum was shared with families last term in preparation for this term, and I would like to encourage families to have discussions at home, about what helps us all to be good learners, and demonstrate our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Resilience. Our utmost priority is ensuring students feel safe and able to learn when at school.

A reminder of our value statements:

- We respect ourselves, our school and each other, and understand that our attitudes and behaviours have an impact on the people around us.
- We model and demonstrate responsibility and take every opportunity to be responsible for actions.
- We are resilient in our disposition by trying our hardest and doing our best, even when things become challenging.

While we continue to embed our practices within the school, and maintain high expectations for student behaviour, we appreciate your support working with us to keep our school a safe place for everyone to learn.

Chinese

In Chinese, the students have had a wonderful start to the term. They enjoyed exploring different aspects of Chinese culture, including traditional Chinese clothing (Hanfu), handwriting $\dot{\mathbb{Z}}$ (Loong), and the Chinese folk dance (Koi fish). Foundation students learned two characters, '大and 小'. They really enjoyed reading the story 'Big and Small' and worked extremely hard on developing recognition of Chinese sounds and handwriting. Grade 1/2 students have learned to count numbers from 11 to 20 and beyond. They were able to write numbers in Chinese and check for their partners. Senior students were very interested in studying their zodiac signs, and they are beginning to understand the personality traits of different zodiac signs. The students worked hard to learn the different types of landforms in Chinese. They explored the structure of characters and enjoyed classifying them according to their structures.
















Grade 4/5/6 Camp – Campaspe Downs

In Week 5 of this term, our Grade 4/5/6 students are extremely excited to be attending a two-night camp at PGL Campaspe Downs, which is an hour's drive from Ballarat. PGL Campaspe Downs is set amid 160 acres of stunning natural bushland in the Macedon Ranges, an adventure camp close to Kyneton and Hanging Rock.

Situated around a central lake, Campaspe Downs focuses on developing students' love for the outdoors and nature and developing resilience and teamwork by offering a wide range of exciting and safe adventure activities. Team challenges, sensory trails, bushcraft, ropes courses, are just a few of the activities that our students will be enjoying. The Camp organisers follow the R.E.A.C.H Framework when implementing the activities. This focusses on Relationships, Experiences, Ability, Character, Health & wellbeing.

My friends and I we all hang out here


This is our school, where we're learning how
