**News from the Principal** 

Dear Families and Friends,

#### **Curriculum Day**

Tomorrow is our Curriculum Day, which of course means we have happy students who get a long weekend! Tomorrow is a day for our staff to continue building on the work already started within the school, working with our coach, Bron, on Responsive Teaching Strategies. This is a wonderful, collegiate day for our staff as we team with two other schools to continue ensuring we deliver the best teaching to our students.

#### **Keeping Well**

This term is flying by very quickly! We are well and truly finding ourselves in the more wintery weather and the germy season is upon us. We have had multiple cases of COVID reported in the school and we encourage all families to support us in keeping everyone healthy by keeping students' home if they are unwell. Students with a fever, vomiting or diarrhoea should be kept away from school for 48 hours after the effects have ceased. We appreciate the community's support while we begin the battle against the cold and flu season over the next few months. It is also a timely reminder that students should be wearing their school jumpers to keep warm in the colder weather. Students can bring warm coats and beanies to wear in the yard (we encourage dark blue if possible) but these are not to be worn in class.

#### **Keeping Safe**

I think this has been mentioned previously, and I am thrilled that our students are being active in their travels to school, however – Our students' safety of utmost importance. Walking and riding to school fosters independence in students, and I encourage families to have a discussion with your children at home about the safe use and travel if they are riding bikes or scooters to school. All students must wear helmets if they are riding or scooting. If a student arrives at school without a helmet for their bike or scooter, a parent or carer will be called to collect the bike or scooter or deliver a helmet so we can ensure our students are safe. We also have an expectation that bikes and scooters are walked through the school. This is for the safety of all in the yard. If it continues that students are riding within the school grounds, parents and carers will be contacted and the student asked not to ride to school.

#### Camp

A very big thank you to Mrs. Hulse, Mrs. Turner, Mrs. Johnson, Max, and Jason for their efforts with our senior camp last week. We are very lucky to have a dedicated team of staff ensuring our students have amazing opportunities. It appears that our students had an amazing time, with the *Leap of Faith* being one of the big highlights! There were plenty of tired faces when they arrived back at school on Friday, but they all seemed very happy with their experience at camp.

#### **Australian Early Development Census (Foundation Students)**

During May and June 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school. The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years. Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information. The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities, and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need. #### Uniform

A small reminder that we take great pride in our school and our uniform. As part of our uniform, we require hair to be tied back if it touches the shoulders – this is for safety and hygiene. For safety, we also ask that students do not wear jewellery other than simple small studs / sleepers, and a watch. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe and well at school.

## Leigh Catchment Group – Landcare Grant

Thank you to Grace Darke who applied for and received a \$5,000 grant for Mount Pleasant Primary School. We are in the process of preparing an area on the school, on the Cobden Street side, to plant with local native plants. Part of the grant is going towards educational activities delivered by the Leigh Catchment Group.

**Waterway Health** The first activity will be held at school on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June. Students will actively collect, group and identify aquatic invertebrates, commonly known as water bugs. A fun and hands on activity.



#### Year 456 Camp - Campaspe Downs

It was such a joy for students to test their limits, try new activities and support those around them. Students became experts at putting on harnesses as they participated in activities such as 'The Leap of Faith,' 'Possum Glider,' 'Flying Fox' and climbing.

Skills of co-ordination, team work and strategy were also practised through archery, orienteering, Aeroball and laser tag.

The nights were also filled with excitement, clearly a little too much as chatting instead of sleeping seemed pretty common throughout the dorms. Prior to

bedtime there were team sports and disco night along with practising the 'Llama Chant.' For many students camp food was highlight and I don't think I've ever seen pineapple consumed in such large quantities.

Educational visits provide our students with unique opportunities to develop their independence away from home and participation in activities they may not otherwise have the opportunity to try. Although all students were tired by the time they came back they should feel proud of their efforts to test their limits and support

#### Sensory Garden Working Bee


Thank you to Grace, Mirinda and the kids that helped with the Sensory Garden working bee.


School photographs will be taken on **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> May**. Personalised student envelopes have been sent home and must be returned with payment on the day of photographs.

# **Every school counts**

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a national census that builds a picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

Every school has a vital role to play in helping our nation collect the information it needs to better understand and respond to the needs of children and their families.

Since 2009, communities, schools and governments across Australia have used AEDC results to help provide services, resources and supports that give our kids the best start in life.

From May 2024, teachers will complete the census for children in their first year of full-time school. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and individual children cannot be identified.

With the support of parents/carers and schools, we can build a more complete picture of early childhood development in Australia. If parents/carers consent to the collection of their child's information they do not need to do anything. Parents/carers only need to contact the school if they do not consent to the collection of their child's information.



My friends and I we all hang out here


This is our school, where we're learning how
