News from the Principal

Dear families,

We are already at the end of Term 3! We have seen lots of change this term and plenty of things have been keeping everyone busy.

Footy Colours Day

We will be celebrating the end of Term tomorrow with a Footy Colours Day. Students are welcome to wear their footy or sports team colours, but can wear casual dress if the sports theme isn't their thing. Our office team are all hoping for a Cats Grand Final appearance!

Illness

We know there are lots of germs doing the rounds at the moment, and we want to thank families for their support in keeping the community well by keeping students home when they are unwell. It is important to remind children on good hygiene at this point of the year to help keep everyone feeling healthy and well. If students are away unwell, please do notify the school for attendance records – this can be done via the Sentral app (preferred), text to our school mobile or phone call.

Walking to School

It is a really great thing to see our students being active and independent on the way to school; walking, riding and scooting. I would like to remind our families of the importance of discussing the responsibilities of traveling to school alone. As a general age, it is recommended that students are accompanied by an adult until 10 years of age when walking to school. Of course, the maturity and responsibility varies greatly among children of different ages and as the carers of the children – you are the best judge of when it is safe for your child to travel to school alone. Some things to consider are; their ability to focus on the journey – being mindful of the roads, other people, animals, staying on the path, and time taken; their ability to react to situations safely – do they know what to do if someone approaches them, if a footpath they use is closed, if they are running late? There are many considerations, however, the opportunity to build trust, responsibility and independence is an important part of maturing.

Recently, the office has received a number of phone calls about the behaviours of some MPPS students when walking to and from school. I would like to encourage families to revisit these conversations at home over the holidays.

Uniform

Next term, we are looking at a uniform challenge. Details will be shared at the beginning of Term 4, but we are looking for the class that is most consistently modelling great MPPS uniform standards. There will be recognition for the class that has the best results. We are still seeing a number of non-uniform items, including grey pants, hoodies, jumpers and coloured shirts under school shirts, bike shorts worn as outer wear (these are only suitable to be worn under dresses or skirts)... We want all our students to make a big effort to wear correct uniform next term! I look forward to sharing the challenge with classes next term.

Staffing Update

This week, Mr. G. took his final PE lessons at MPPS. He is relocating and moving on to new adventures. It was nice to see the students creating farewell messages for him! Our new PE teacher begins next term. Mr. Steinman, or 'Steiny' as he is well known by his students, comes to us with excellent PE experience and is going to be with us for the remainder of the year. We look forward to him joining the MPPS team.

We also welcomed Mrs. Brearley into the 5/6 room last week. She has taken over from Mrs. Hulse, who has resigned from her position to move north with her family. The 5/6s are settling well into routines with Mrs. Brearley.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club has been a huge success this term – running every morning for our students to access fresh toast, fruit, cereal, and milk. The students have been enjoying sitting together to eat as the weather improves. I want to thank our handful of parent helpers who have dedicated time of a morning to assist in running the Breakfast Club with us. Without their help, it wouldn't be possible to keep this going every day for our students. We are desperately calling out for assistance to keep the Breakfast Club running in Term 4 – if you can spare 30-40 minutes one morning per week, we would be greatly appreciative! Please contact the office to advise of any availability. Without the helpful assistance from our community, it becomes harder to keep it running!

Attendance

A friendly reminder that if your child is going to be away from the school on any day, it is a requirement to let the school know the reason for our attendance record keeping. Students who arrive late, or are picked up early also need an explanation provided. This is a requirement for all schools. Students who are collected early from school by their parents without a valid reason are marked absent. This is then recorded as an unexplained absence on your child's attendance records.

I'd like to also remind our families of the importance of regular attendance and arriving on time for the most important learning. Attendance has a big impact on the success of students as they progress through school. At MPPS, our learning begins at 9am – and the first 2-3 hours are the most important part of our learning programs. I've included the graphic below to show the increasing, long-term effect that missing school has on a student. I encourage all of our families to aim high and prioritise their child's success with good attendance habits.


Breakfast Club Parent Helpers Needed Term 4!

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about <u>Enrolling in School</u>.
- Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us.
 You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address
- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system.

Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email.



Step Two: Type in the school's name.














Step Four: Choose your preferences


