




## Chinese

Over the past month or so, we have continued to be very busy during Chinese lessons. Foundation students continue to make posters to introduce their family members. They worked hard to write a sentence: 'This is my...' in Chinese. Students enjoyed learning the Chinese song 'Two Tigers'. They learned the basic stroke order when writing Chinese words. Year 1/2 students learned to build a sentence to introduce their favourite colour, 'I like...'. They put a great deal of effort into their handwriting. Year 3/4 students have explored the Mid-Autumn Festival, which is the most important event after the Chinese New Year. That enjoyed retelling the legend of Chang E and Hou Yi. Year 5/6 students have learned to write a holiday recount in Chinese. They experimented with Google Translate and were able to interpret their writing into Chinese characters.














Our introduction programs include:

Sentral e-resource Registering on the Sentral for Parents App for the first time





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
Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.




Step Two: Type in the school's name.



Step Three: Choose 'Register Here' from the bottom of the screen. Complete the details and choose 'Create Account'. You will receive a verification email which MUST be verified to continue. When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.



Step Four: Choose your preferences



Step Five: Connect to your child in this screen 'Add Access Key'. The access key is written on the note/email sent to you from the school. It is case sensitive so type it in exactly as it appears in the note/email.



Step Five: You are now connected and can interact with the App.
