Dear families,

Online safety

I want to emphasise the importance of monitoring our children's social media usage, particularly regarding age restrictions.

It's crucial to remember that no primary-aged child should have a social media account. These platforms are designed for older teens and adults, and allowing younger children to engage can expose them to risks they may not be ready to handle.

Younger students also have not developed a strong understanding of the implications of sharing information online.

Starting early with clear guidelines and open discussions about social media will help our kids develop a healthy relationship with technology. Fostering these conversations now can lead to more responsible behaviour as they grow older. Let's work together to ensure our children navigate the online world safely and positively.

Safety and Independence

I want to encourage our families to have a discussion around the expectations and responsibilities involved when students are taking that independent step in walking or riding to and from school without an adult. We have had recent incidents where parents have expected that their children are at school, and they have not arrived at school. I can imagine the panic and worry that must set in to receive a call or message to say your child hasn't arrived at school. As a school, student safety is paramount.

The responsibilities and skills that students require to walk to school include, but are not limited to:

- Road safety awareness
- Community / stranger danger awareness
- Ability to react appropriately to situations around them in the community (do they know how to seek help?)
- Time management skills
- Ability to make responsible decisions even when around peers (not succumb to peer pressure)

If children do not demonstrate these behaviours, they school be accompanied to and from school by a responsible adult.

While we absolutely want to promote independence in students, we prioritise the safety of all students. I encourage our families to really consider the potential safety impact if your child does not demonstrate the above skills and take into consideration whether older children have the extra required ability to care for and make responsible decisions for younger siblings.

I thank our community for their support in keeping everyone safe.





At school, we are learning about a period of time called The Renaissance. It's a time in human history when people start to realize things about the world and get eager to learn.




Supporting Our Community

Basketball Ballarat Term 4 Community Programs



Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.

When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.










Step Four: Choose your preferences



My friends and I we all hang out here


