We are looking forward to seeing our families this afternoon for our Family Night! It looks like the weather will be kind to us. too.

Safety Reminder

After the devastating tragedy last week at Auburn South PS, I would like to add a timely reminder to our families on the importance of driving safely around schools. Please follow the road rules at all times and take extra care at pick up / drop off times. For example; It may take people an extra 30 seconds to pull out of the car park safely and do a u-turn where appropriate, but reversing across the wrong side of the road is terribly dangerous and breaking the road rules. Please adhere to the 40km speed limit around schools.

Our thoughts are with the school community and family of the 11 year old boy, who died last week after a car accident at his school, and the four other families who had seriously injured children. Our children are precious and irreplaceable - please take care.

Sun Smart

As the UV levels rise above 3 across Victoria, it's time to remind children of the importance of being Sun Smart.

Exposure to the sun's UV during childhood and adolescence has a big impact on skin cancer risk – but it's almost entirely preventable with good sun protection:

- SLIP on sun protective clothing
- SLOP on SPF50+ broad spectrum water-resistent sunscreen
- SLAP on a wide brim hat
- SEEK shade when outdoors
- SLIDE on sunglasses, where practical (students are allowed to wear them at school while outside)

As a Sun Smart school we require all students to wear hats outside during recess and outdoor activities. Any student without a hat is expected to play in our shaded quiet area. We do still have hats available at the office for \$6.

Student Leadership 2025

Next week, discussions will begin with our current Grade 5 students about student leadership positions for 2025. I encourage families to talk at home with their Grade 5 children about what role they might like to pursue. A great discussion point might include 'What does it take to be a leader at school?' or 'How do you show the school values?'

I look forward to discussing the leadership roles with students next week.


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!!

We're having a fabulous Term 4 in Performing Arts. Here's some highlights so far:

In Grade F we have created our own Underwater Creature movements including animals such as sharks, dolphins, turtles, clams, clown fish, a treasure chest and a shipwreck. We will be acting out fun moments from story books later this term.


Step One: Download the Sentral for Parents app.




Step Two: Type in the school's name.

When the verification link is clicked it opens the log in screen in browser – close the browser and go back to the Sentral for Parents app.



Step Four: Choose your preferences



Step Five: Connect to your child in this screen 'Add Access Key'. The access key is written on the note/email sent to you from the school. It is case sensitive so type it in exactly as it appears in the note/email.
