Celebrating Diversity and Standing Against Racism

Celebrating the diversity of our community makes us stronger, kinder and innovative. We are committed to ensuring that students from all backgrounds feel accepted, supported and are empowered to learn.

We have taken steps to ensure the school is a place free of racism and where everyone feels welcome, respected and supported. To achieve our values and aims, everyone at Mount Pleasant Primary School plays an important role, and we are writing to ask for your support at home, as we support at school through our Respectful Relationships teaching and learning program and links to the Personal and Social Capabilities of our Victorian Curriculum.

- understand the importance of everyone at school being treated with respect;
- understand that Mount Pleasant Primary School takes racism very seriously;

Hello Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy Semester in Class 1/2! As we approach the end of Term 2, we can look back on the amazing progress with have made with our Literacy and Numeracy skills, as well as developing our resilience as we adapt to changes throughout the weeks.

One of the key focuses this year has been strengthening our sentence writing skills to include nouns, verbs and adjectives. We have then practiced expanding our story writing and informative texts with coordinating conjunctions (for example: so, and, but) and subordinating conjunctions (because, that). As we work towards writing our own Informative Text next week, we have practiced incorporating these into our daily writing time and the students are very proud of their work.

In our Maths we have covered Shapes (2D and 3D), Addition, Subtraction, Measurement, Time and Number Lines. Wherever possible we use hands on manipulatives to develop our understanding of key topics. Our Flower Number Line has been on display in our room this term, and I have included photos of a few activities we have done so far this year.























Congratulations Extend
